Mr. James (Jim) R. Mandryck is the acting Deputy Assistant Commissioner for the Office of Intelligence, Operations Support. In this role, he leads the development, coordination, and implementation of intelligence capabilities in support of CBP's mission to secure America's borders while facilitating legitimate trade and travel.

Prior to assuming his current role, Mr. Mandryck was the Executive Director for the National Border Security Intelligence Watch, Office of Intelligence. In this role, Mr. Mandryck oversaw all-source indications and warning support for current and emerging threats; development and maintenance of the CBP Common Intelligence Picture; and the cohesive tasking, collection management, processing, exploitation, and dissemination of intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance data.

Mr. Mandryck has served in a variety of leadership roles in the Office of Intelligence, including Director of the Current and Emerging Threats Division and the Strategic Intelligence and Analysis Division. Prior to joining the Office of Intelligence in 2008, he worked for the U.S. Border Patrol; and from 2004 to 2008, he served as a Deputy with the Oneida County Sheriff's Office in New York State.

Mr. Mandryck holds a Master's Degree in Business Administration from American Military University, and a Bachelor's degree in Psychology from the State University of New York.
